RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District desires to embark upon a project known as "District-Wide Capital Improvements" which project shall include capital improvements to the buildings as follows:

- Walter G. O'Connell Copiague High School, 1100 Dixon Avenue: interior renovations and upgrades; renovations to existing outdoor athletic fields; construction of a new tennis court.
- Copiague Middle School, 2650 Great Neck Road: interior renovations and upgrades; renovations to existing outdoor athletic facilities; repair and/or replacement in kind to exterior paving (roadways and sidewalks).
- Great Neck Road Elementary School, 1400 Great Neck Road: interior renovations and upgrades.
- Susan E. Wiley Elementary School, Scudder Avenue: repair and/or replacement in kind to exterior paving; grading repairs to a grassed area approximately 10,000 square feet in size (area to be restored to lawn).
- Deauville Gardens Elementary School, 100 Deauville Boulevard: The Deauville Gardens school building is a single building that houses both the Deauville Gardens East and Deauville Gardens West Elementary Schools. The improvements will include construction of three (3) additions to

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the existing school building totaling approximately 32,000 square feet; construction of a new bus loop on the east side of the building (for Deauville Gardens East School); construction of a new parking lot approximately 26,350 square feet (approximately 54 cars); and relocation of playground; and

WHEREAS, said "District-Wide Capital Improvements" are subject to classification and review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA);

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District has designated itself as lead agency pursuant to the implementing regulations of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, specifically 6 NYCRR §617.6(b)(4); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District, as lead agency, has caused to be prepared an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) to evaluate potential significant adverse environmental impacts of the proposed action;

WHEREAS, said "District-Wide Capital Improvements" are classified as an Unlisted Action under SEQRA Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as the lead agency, has examined the EAF and all information related to the "District-Wide Capital Improvements" and has determined that the "District-Wide Capital Improvements" would have no significant adverse impact on the environment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District, as lead agency for the action contemplated herein, after review of the proposed action, 6 NYCRR Part 617, the EAF and the associated documents, hereby determines that the above-described project is an Unlisted Action and has no significant adverse impact on the environment which would require further review under SEQRA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby shall forward an official copy of this Resolution to the New York State Education Department, together with the Negative Declaration, which declares no adverse impact on the environment and the correspondence from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, which found no adverse impact on Cultural Resources.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE COPIAGUE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A Special District Meeting of the qualified voters of the Copiague Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), shall be held within the District, on Thursday, November 13, 2014, at 10:00 o'clock A.M. (Prevailing Time) at the Gymnasium of the Great Neck Road Elementary School, Great Neck Road, Copiague, New York, in said District, as provided in the Notice calling said Special District Meeting hereinafter substantially prescribed. The voting at such Special District Meeting shall be by voting machine, as provided by the Education Law, and the polls shall remain open from 10:00 o'clock A.M. to 10:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) on said day and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters, then present, to cast their votes.

Section 2. The business to be acted upon at said Special District Meeting shall be as stated in the Notice thereof, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause the Notice of said Special District Meeting to be published in "*The Amityville Record*" and "*The Beacon*," two

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newspapers each having a general circulation within the District, such publications to be at least made four (4) times within the seven (7) weeks next preceding such Special District Meeting, the first publications to be at least forty-five (45) days prior to the date of said Special District Meeting.

That the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District, in the County (a) of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and/or sites (the "Project") substantially as described in a Report entitled "2014 Copiague Capital Project-Infrastructure Improvements," prepared for the District with the assistance of Wendel Architecture, (the "Report"), which Report is on file and available for public inspection at the office of the District Clerk, including: interior reconstruction, space reconfiguration and building additions to provide for new and/or enhanced classroom, science, physics, chemistry, music, and other space; improvements to the heating, ventilation, air conditioning, electrical, plumbing, lighting, and public address systems; the replacement of windows, doors, floors, ceilings, auditorium seating and bleachers; technology infrastructure improvements; site, security, parking, sidewalk, building envelope, masonry and bus loop improvements; and athletic and recreation improvements including track and field reconstruction and/or replacements and the replacement of tennis courts; all of the foregoing to include all furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, and ancillary and related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated total cost of \$69,400,815; provided that the costs of the components of the Project as set forth in the Report may be reallocated among such components if the Board of Education shall determine that such reallocation is in the best interest of the District;

(b) that a tax is hereby voted therefore in the amount of not to exceed \$69,400,815, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and

(c) that in anticipation of said tax, the Board of Education is authorized to issue bonds of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed \$69,400,815 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Such Bond Proposition shall appear on the ballot labels to be inserted in the voting machines used for voting at said Special District Meeting in substantially the following condensed form:

(a) That the Board of Education of the Copiague Union Free School District, New York, (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and/or sites, and to expend \$69,400,815 therefor; (b) that a tax is hereby voted therefore in the amount of not to exceed \$69,400,815, such tax to be levied and collected in

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installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and (c) that in anticipation of said tax, the Board of Education is authorized to issue bonds of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed \$69,400,815 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

The voting will be conducted by ballot on voting machines as provided in the Education Law and the polls will remain open from 10:00 o'clock A.M. to 10:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters then present to cast their ballots.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Education Law §2014, personal registration of voters is required, and no person shall be entitled to vote at the Special District Meeting whose name does not appear on the register of the District.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that voters at the May 19, 1998 Copiague School Budget/Trustee Election approved Continuous Voter Registration. Qualified voters may register on a continuous basis as follows: Registration will be conducted Monday through Friday from 9:00 o'clock A.M. to 3:00 o'clock P.M. during the school year, and from 9:00 o'clock A.M. to 1:00 o'clock P.M. during school recesses at the Office of the District Clerk, Central Administration Office, 2650 Great Neck Road, Copiague, to add any names to the Register to be used at said Special District Meeting, at which time any person will be entitled to have his or her name placed on such Register, provided that he or she is known or proven to be then or thereafter entitled to vote at such election for which the register is prepared. There will be no registration allowed after seven (7) days prior to said Special District Meeting.

Any person whose name appears on such Register or who shall have been previously registered hereunder or who shall have voted at any Annual or Special District Meeting or Election held or conducted at any time since January 1, 2010 will not be required to register personally for said Special District Meeting.

In addition, any person otherwise qualified to vote who is registered with the Board of Elections of Suffolk County under the provisions of the Election Law shall be entitled to vote at said Special District Meeting without further registration.

The register of the qualified voters of said District prepared for the Annual School District Meeting and Election held on May 20, 2014, shall be used as the basis for the preparation of the Register for said Special District Meeting to be held on November 13, 2014.

The register so prepared will be filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District, and will be open for inspection by any qualified voter of the District beginning on November 7, 2014, between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and 3:00 o'clock P.M., (Prevailing Time), on weekdays, and each day prior to the day set for the election, except Sunday, November 9, 2014 and Tuesday, November 11, 2014, and on Saturday, November 8, 2014, by appointment only.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that applications for absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the District Clerk. If the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, the completed application must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. on November 6, 2014. If the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter at the office of the District Clerk, the completed application must be received by the District Clerk no later than 3:00 o'clock P.M. on November 12, 2014, the weekday before the date set for the Special District Meeting.
